Policy process

There is still time to take part in our 2019 policy process. Here's how to have your say.



Our annual policy process gives members and local parties the chance to shape the Co-operative Party's position on key issues by sharing their ideas and experiences.

This year members can respond to consultations on two policy areas:

- Community, place and power
- Climate change, energy and environment

Submissions made by members over the year form the starting point for debates at regional conferences throughout the year and at National Conference, which is held in October.

The consultation process runs until Monday 17 June 2019.

How to take part

All individual members, local parties and co-operative societies are invited to make a response to either or both consultation topics.

While responses from those with relevant experience or expertise are encouraged, everyone is encouraged to take part. Equally valuable are your experiences and first-hand insights from your community.

Respond online

The most straightforward way to have your say is by responding online. You can make a response either as an individual or on behalf of a local party or organisation, with the option of either uploading a document containing your response or answering a short questionnaire. www.party.coop/policy/new
